My Friends,



Why Am I Still A Cursillista

Asked to comment on why I am still active in Cursillo [2019 will be 49 years since my weekend], it offered an opportunity to reflect on the effect Cursillo has had on my life. When bringing my Rolleiflex camera on my weekend, there was little indication that it would be the start of a fairly long tradition, but tradition it became and remains. When it came time for the group picture, I thought, "I could do that." What a great gift that turned out to be...to me.

First, there were the friendships established: my sponsor; the Rector; my table leader. Then, largely through them, the fellowship within the Cursillo community followed: a second great gift to me. Like many youngish Catholics of my time, I wanted to show appreciation for the blessings God was giving my family and me. Ah, but how could I this? How about my table leader's friend who was bringing the Cursillo dynamic to the state prisons? That should work, and it did. There I was, in prison, doing Residents Encounter Christ weekends, including the group picture: a third great gift to me. Of course I had to continue taking the Cursillo group picture. How could I not do so?

Even before this, I helped on bible discussion Tuesdays at Fishkill prison with Jesuit Chaplain Fr. Fred Rothlauf, a Cursillista. This was yet another gift from Cursillo. Payback was getting more difficult to keep up with, so I had to be Director [a.k.a Rector] on Rec's. When the first coordinator for our region's REC's retired, I took over from him and owned the job for somewhere around a dozen years...all this starting with Cursillo, and I continued taking the pictures. After 43 years of REC's, I now only do perhaps one a year; we can't take group pictures in prison now, but I can still take the Cursillo group picture. So that has been the effect of Cursillo on my life, and why I'm still active in the movement.



1st Conversations of Cala Figuera, Foundation Eduardo Bonnín Aguiló (FEBA). The revised translation of this book describes Days of Reflection on the Founding Charism of the Cursillo. These Days of Reflection were held in “The Porciúncula” (Palma de Mallorca), on the 50th Anniversary of the First Cursillo Weekend held in Cala Figuera in Santanyi, on the Island of Mallorca, Spain in August 1944. The following outline is on the 4th topic, Friendship. There are 10 topics in the 1st Conversations of Cala Figuera revised translation. · The most profound form of living together is friendship.

- To be a friend is to feel free and safe to think out loud.
- The relationship of friendship is the genuinely human and evangelical form of communication between men/women; it is communicating with the other as a person, not because of their specific qualities or social position, but simply because he/she was born and exists and because he/she is a person.
- Friendship can be summarized in this double affirmation: “I am glad that you exist”, “the world is more beautiful because you exist”. Friendship takes shape through a process.
- Friendship is what can produce the powerful energy that can move men and women to change reality. The Christian way is the simple and definitive joy of being friends with people close to you.
- If man has no one to support him, he has no stamina and becomes unbearable.
- To make friends is to see, to help people see, and manage to get them to become aware of what they are seeing. Cursillo is the vehicle for an experience of identity, a celebration of life and a tribute to friendship. · The key lies in a friendly knowledge and acceptance of oneself as one is.
- Friendship is creative but is not an objective in itself, excluding its natural dynamism to generate more friendship.




REDISCOVERING CURSILLO






COMMUNION BREAKFAST, STATEN ISLAND




ULTREYA


