Message from the Lay Director

The Spanish word "ultreya" means "onward." It was a shout of enthusiasm by the first pilgrimage to the shrine of St. James of Compostela. And so we use that term to mean that which encourages all of us who attend the Ultreya to continue, to persevere in our Christian life as apostles for Jesus Christ. The purpose of the Ultreya is to keep the spirit and friendship of a Cursillo ongoing in order that it may be a motivating force for all of us to live the idealand to evanglize. Ultreya is the place where frindshbips are built within the lager community. The Ulteya in its totality is the sharing of our Christian life.

- It is a community that makes itself visible in gatherings where they come together in an attitude of progressive conversion.
- It is a community united in one faith, one Lord and one baptism.
- It gathers to facilitate the livin and sharing of what is fundamental to being a Christian.
- It also serves as an opportunity to come in contact with the larger Christian community and to help those who may not have formed a permanent friendship group.

It has been six years since I accepted the challenge to serve this movement as head of the school of leaders and it has been a wonderful journey and I look forward to serving this movement in whatever capacity God calls me. It was truly impressive and it shows that the Cursillo movement in the Rockford diocese is heading in the right direction.

In the Piety talk that I will now give this fall, I talk about our faith, our life of piety. I say it must be constantly growing. It can never stagnate. Our faith is either growing or it is dying, one or the other. If we ever get to the point in our life that we feel we have "made it" and do not have to do anything else, that is the day our faith starts to die. The same analogy can be said of the school. It is either growing or it is dying, it cannot remain the same. That is why I hope and pray that our new leadership will continue to strive to make the school and this movement even stronger in our diocese. Know that you will always be in my prayers. I am looking forward to serving this movement in what ever God asks of me.


Ken volunteers at Holy Cross as a lector, works Hesed House once a month, and helps his wife with Enriching Lives, a senior citizen ministry.

50 years of Cursillo in Rockford

Cursillo has changed many people's lives over those fifty years:

- Bishop Arthur O'Neill called the Cursillo "the best kept secret in the Catholic Church".
- Lois Wright was attracted to Hook's painting of Jesus which
 was displayed in the Chapel; and she rememberd Enzler's
 "Everyone's Way of the Cross" every Friday evening on the
 weekends. She also remembers some team members praying
 a Palanca Rosary, kneeling with arms extended; some would
 become so tired that friends were needed to assist them by
 holding up their arms. Things like the above helped plant the
 seed of the Cursillo in the Wright family that continues
 to this day.
- Ken Sittenauer remembers driving from Dixon to Aurora every Friday for School of Leaders. Ken was Lay Director four years, and when transferred to Kansas City, he started the movement there and served an additional 10 years as Lay Director, as well as 22 years with the National and International Secretariats.
- Margaret Johnson said that Cursillo brought the love of Jesus into her family and community and that she stayed involved because of the love of the Christian community that she felt every weekend she worked.
- Fr. Robert Sherry was able to inspire a new parish to grow with a strong spiritual foundation partly achieved by promoting Cursillo, and Cursillo sustained him over his 45 years of service to the diocese.
- Elaine Pfluger shared that her husband, Robert, made the first men's Cursillo in Rockford and she went to South Bend, Indiana, to bring the women's Cursillo to the Rockford diocese shortly after. "The Cursillo changed our lives 50 years ago and our friends are the ones we met through those years," she says.

Al Johnson believes that his life was changed by the weekend.
 "I made my Cursillo and I started down a new path that I pray lasts the rest of my life," he vows.

This list is far from complete and could continue for many pages. The number of Cursillistas that have gone on to become Deacons and Priests are so numerous I was not able to come up with an exact number.

Since the early days the weekends have remained pretty consistent but here are some differences that may surprise you:

- Instead of having a central location, Cursillo weekends moved from parish to parish, usually held in a school or gym. All sup plies, including cots and tables, were moved in a trailer that was unloaded and then packed up again for every week end. Deacon Harold Poss stored the materials in his company warehouse.
- Not all locations had showers available. Fr. Harold Nilges, pastor of St. Catherine's, installed showers in the boiler room himself so we could have weekends in Genoa.
- Early on, smoking was allowed in the conference room.
- Posters were made after every talk, not just once each night
- Musicians were only used for DeColores and for Masses; all speakers were greeted a cappella.
- Because it was hard to get priests for confession, not everyone had the opportunity to receive the sacrament as we have now.
- Many times Cursillo was forced to borrow dishes from Annunciation, St Peter's and other parishes.
- Aurora had Ultreyas every Sunday with 50 or more attending.
- Every Cursillo weekend was good, but some were exceptional.
- The Rockford Diocese hosted the National Cursillo Encounter sometime during the 70's.

Now that we have looked at how Cursillo has changed lives and some of the changes over the years, it is important to say that Rockford has remained strong due to the people Cursillo has touched. I hope everyone will join us at the celebration of 50 years at the picnic Saturday, August 10, 2013 in Hampshire (see flier for more information).
