Message from the Lay Director

The Year of Faith started on October 11, 2012, and continues to November 24, 2013. It is a "summons to an authentic and renewed conversion to the Lord, the One Savior of the world". In other words, the Year of Faith is an opportunity for Catholics to experience a conversion – to turn back to Jesus and enter into a deeper relationship with him. The "door of faith" is opened at one's baptism, but during this year Catholics are called to open it again, walk through it and rediscover and renew their relationship with Christ and his Church.

We are summoned. We need to be authentic. We need to renew our Faith in God. We need a deeper and personal relationship with Jesus and His Church

This is exactly what we do in the Cursillo Movement. We open the door for our brothers and sisters to know Christ. Our weekends, groupings and Ultreyas all focus on our relationship with Christ. We help each other deepen this relationship with our Lord.

We are a group of people who are all working to have Christianity lived in society by means of a certain strategy and method. The measure of the success of the Cursillo Movement is the degree to which there is a change being made in the world. The Cursillo Movement is succeeding when more and more people are striving to form Christian life in their environments, when more and more people are coming to know Christ and becoming what Christ wants them to be.

The Cursillo Movement has a clearly unified goal with a developed strategy and approach, Structuring Christian Life. It has a method which helps people become more committed to Christ and His Church, a method which can help them persevere and grow in holiness, a method which can help them to remain linked together through Jesus Christ. It is this method that provides the organization that is needed to make all this possible.

The method promotes the proclaiming Christ as a witness, not as a teacher. People are touched more by witnesses than by teachers. The most effective teachers are also the most effective witnesses. The Cursillo method is neither apologetical nor catechetical. It is Christ-centered, testimonial, and personal. It is a road to conversion. It is communal and inductive. We are all touched by the witness of others in our lives. We remember the witness of the speakers from the weekends even if we do not remember anything else from the talks. That is why we group and share at all our meetings.

We need to be more Faithful. Not only just for the Year of Faith, but for Jesus and each other. Faith is not just a state of mind or a belief. It is who we are and what we do. Believing is not enough. Action is required to fulfill our beliefs. True belief turns into action that allows us to be Witnesses for Him. That is the path to Faithfulness. We are called to serve. We are called to lead. We need to be Servant Leaders. Go serve and lead. God's Peace, Love and Joy be with you.

This summer we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of Cursillo in the Rockford Diocese and in honor of that 50 years we will be hosting a picnic for all Cursillistas and their families. We will let you know of the date for the picnic as soon as we book a location. Please watch the website for more information.

The first English Cursillo in the United States was in 1961 and the following year it was in Chicago and soon thereafter plans were underway to bring the Cursillo movement to the Rockford diocese. The first weekend in Rockford was August 8-11, 1963 at Muldoon high school in Rockford. The Rector was Norm Rapp from Chicago and his assistant was Francis Murphy who had just made his weekend in Chicago. The Spiritual Director was also from Chicago that first weekend, Fr Michael Cody.

Just 3 month later on Nov. 7-10, 1963 Rockford hosted its second weekend which was under the direction of the Rockford Diocese new Spiritual Director, Fr. William Knott, (now living in Sun City, AZ) and now Francis Murphy was ready to be the Rector. Fr. Knott was spiritual director on the next 4 weekends. Joseph Kiegel would be the assistant for that weekend but would follow up by being the first of only few men who would be Rector twice. The others were Charles Luecke, Jim Hodapp, Ken Sittenauer and Bob Wright. One, Jake McCabe actually was Rector 3 times.

The men would have 5 weekends before the women had their first on May 20-23, 1965. It was held at St. Josephs in Freeport and Madolin Witte was the Rectora. Her assistant was Rae DuFore who was then the next Rectora 6 month later. Fr. James O'Brien was the Spiritual Director for the first 2 women's weekends. The women have had a number of repeat Rectoras starting with Bart Williams 4 times and Barbara Roman, Shirley McCabe, Toni Hodapp, Lois Wright, Margaret Johnson, Tricia Aurand, and Donna Mancini each

serving twice. We have been bless with many priest that have been Spiritual Directors (number of times) including; Fr. Michael Cody(1), Fr. William Knott(4), Fr. James O'Brien(2), Fr. John Reuland (14), Fr. William Collins(12), Fr. Thomas Caughlin(2), Fr. John Regan(1), Fr. Andrew Plesa(12), Fr. Jack Wentland(5), Fr. John Slampak(1), Fr. Timothy Piasecki(2), Fr. Richard Kramer(24), Fr. Geoffrey Wirth(3), Msgr. Robert Willhite(10), Fr. Harold Nigles(23) Fr. Robert Sherry(2), Fr. Mike Mas(2), Msgr. Dan Hermes(2), Fr. Steve St. Jules(1), Fr. Sylvester Eye(1), Msgr. Thomas Bales(4), Fr. Alan Rekate(1), Fr. Bill Morrissey(1),

Msgr. Thomas Dempsey(1), Bishop Arthur O'Neill(1), Fr. Richard Grek(1), Fr. John Dalton(2), Fr. Max Striedl(2), Fr. Joe Nicolosi(2), Fr. Addison Hart(1), Fr. Lou Busemeyer(1), Fr.
